

ACCREDITATION & ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

LHS provides a unique educational environment in which students are empowered to find identity, meaning and purpose for their lives in Christ while developing individual talents, skills and attitudes to achieve academically and make thoughtful Christian decisions.

LHS is regionally and nationally accredited by the Lutheran Schools Accreditation

Commission, which is recognized by the Commissioner of Education of the Texas Education

Agency (TEA). LHS is a member of the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools

(TAPPS), the Independent Schools Association and the Association of Lutheran Secondary

Schools (ALSS).

Our goal is to provide an educational environment of acceptance that empowers and engages students to succeed academically. By providing students with a strong moral and spiritual foundation, students excel in every measure of academic achievement — including ACT composite and SAT test scores above state and national averages. In recent years, LHS graduated a National Merit Scholar, National Commended Scholar and a National Merit Commended Hispanic Scholar. In fact, 98 percent of students graduating from LHS go on to universities across the country, and those who receive scholarships average \$20,000 per award.

FACULTY & CURRICULUM

At the heart of our school are people sharing the loving message of our Lord Jesus Christ in everything they do. LHS is blessed with a highly qualified and trained faculty that is dedicated to the individual academic and spiritual growth of every student. While providing a secure and comforting setting, each faculty member is enthusiastic about teaching and encourages active involvement in learning.

Our academic program exceeds the standards outlined by the TEA. The LHS core and elective curriculum is extensive, and in most subjects, students may participate in regular, honors or advanced placement (AP) courses. Typically, students will carry eight classes in a modified block schedule, and our small class sizes allow for personalized attention and instruction.

As the city's only Lutheran High School, LHS is supported by six area congregations of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod forming the Lutheran High School Association.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS




NEW & PLANNED FACILITIES

Through the receipt of a \$3 million grant from Bill and Louree Greehey, through the Greehey Family Foundation, LHS has begun construction of phase one expansion of the campus including approximately 40,000 square feet of classrooms, cafeteria, gymnasium and other athletic amenities. The building, which is scheduled for completion in spring of 2009, will house the school's new band and choir rooms, art room, biology, physics and chemistry labs, classrooms, cafeteria, gymnasium, weight room and locker rooms.

Future planned facilities include additional classrooms, athletic fields, auditorium, library and media center, full-service cafeteria and administrative office.
