SpawGlass Helping to Make Harlandale ISD Campus A Little Greener This Earth Day Contractor, dignitaries broke ground on educational greenhouse renovation and new construction to support horticulture program and improve greenhouse accessibility at special education center

(San Antonio, TX) – Commercial contractor SpawGlass, Harlandale Independent School District (HISD) representatives and students, and local dignitaries broke ground today on renovation work and new construction for educational greenhouses at the Jewel C. Weitzel special education center located at 9131 Yett Dr.

SpawGlass is currently working on multiple construction projects for HISD, including classroom additions/improvements, athletic facilities, kitchen/dining facilities, administrative space and ADA/life safety upgrades at a number of elementary, middle and high school campuses.
