SpawGlass selected for two City of San Antonio Projects Contractor to complete improvements to Convention Center and Terminal 2 Demolition at Airport

SpawGlass, a local employee-owned commercial contractor, has been selected as construction manager-at-risk for an approximately \$9.3 million capital improvement project at the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center. In addition, SpawGlass was awarded the San Antonio International Airport Terminal 2 Demolition and Gate B1 Opening project for approximately \$6 million.

“San Antonio remains a highly desirable destination,” says Guillermo Moya, City of San Antonio Project Manager. “Facility enhancements to the convention center will make San Antonio even more competitive in attracting visitors to the Alamo City.”

SpawGlass will provide consultation during the design of the convention center project and construction services for renovation of select areas of the convention center’s interior, and improvements along the west bank exterior. The project includes renovation of existing ballrooms and exhibit halls, elevator upgrades and stairwell modifications. Exterior improvements include façade veneer and flatwork, resurfacing of sidewalks, landscaping, and possible accessibility improvements such as sidewalk and railing repairs.

The convention center project begins in February and is scheduled for completion in fall 2011.

“While SpawGlass is making certain parts of the Convention Center new again, we also will be literally tearing down the old Terminal 2 at the San Antonio International Airport as we make way for the new Terminal B,” says Chuck Calvin, SpawGlass President, San Antonio Region. “We’re excited to be a part of each of these projects as we continue our long-term relationship with the City of San Antonio.”

The Terminal 2 Demolition and Gate B1 Opening at the San Antonio International Airport consists of the decommissioning of the old Terminal 2, including: demolition, excavation and abatement of the old terminal foundation, grading, paving, and installation of sidewalks and permanent fencing for the Airport Operations Area, as well as pier construction of Gate B1 in the new Terminal B.

“Mobility is a priority for both the residents of and visitors to San Antonio,” says Rich Johnson, City of San Antonio Aviation Public Relations Manager. “These improvements are part of a strategic goal to enhance airport facilities and bring convenience to travelers in and out of the city.”

The airport project is scheduled for completion in early 2012.
